Fire Sirens for June 1 through June 4

June 1 Shoreline Firefighters responded to 19 calls, 16 of them for medical emergencies.

Firefighters took an 18 year old male to the hospital after he was found with difficulty breathing near 175th and 15th NE. He had reportedly consumed a half bottle of rum and several beers.

They also responded to a mother who reported her daughter had taken 15 or more ibuprofen.

And they took an elderly male to the hospital after he suffered a diabetic emergency at McDonalds on Aurora Avenue North.

June 2 Shoreline Firefighters responded to 31 calls today, 23 of them for medical emergencies.

Responses included two cardiac arrest calls that turned out to be drug overdoses, 2 bark fires, a car fire, a hazardous materials call, and 3 automatic fire alarms, no fire found.

June 3 Shoreline Firefighters responded to 26 calls, 18 of them for medical emergencies.

There were 2 smoke complaints, both turned out to be backyard barbecues. Firefighters also responded to 2 automatic fire alarms with no fire found and 2 minor motor vehicle crashes.

June 4 Shoreline Firefighters responded 27 calls, 21 of them for medical emergencies.

Crews responded to smoke visible at the Shoreline Community College gym, and to a series of small brush fires near 149th and 1st NE.

They also had a reporting of arcing/sparking electrical lines, and two commercial fire alarms, no fire found.
